

Dear Parish Family,

Today is World Marriage Day and Valentine's Day. Therefore, each of our Liturgies will include a special blessing for engaged and married couples.

This Wednesday is Ash Wednesday, the beginning of Lent.

On Ash Wednesday, we will celebrate Mass and distribute ashes at 9:30 a.m. and 6:00 p.m. Also, every Friday evening during Lent, there will be Stations of the Cross and Holy Communion at 5:30 p.m. Please note the announcement elsewhere in the Theresean about how we will receive ashes this year.

Beginning on Ash Wednesday, there will also be a change to the ending of the opening prayers at Mass. Currently most of these prayers end with "one God, forever and ever." Beginning Ash Wednesday, the ending will be simply "God, forever and ever." This will make the English translation conform to the original Latin of the Roman Missal which never included the word *one*.

Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are days of fast and abstinence. The other Fridays of Lent are days of abstinence. The law of abstinence requires Catholics 14 years of age and older to abstain from eating meat. The law of fasting requires Catholics from the age of eighteen until their fifty-ninth birthday to fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. The Church defines fasting as one main meal a day and two smaller meals which if added together would not be larger than the main meal.

Besides ashes on Ash Wednesday, a small remembrance will be available to everyone who comes to Mass on the First Sunday of Lent, February 20-21. Please be here to receive this remembrance which will serve as a challenge to us this Lent.

Dynamic Catholic is offering **Best Lent Ever 2021.** According to Dynamic Catholic, "Nothing will transform your life so completely, absolutely, and forever like really learning how to pray. That's why this year's BEST LENT EVER journeys through Matthew Kelly's latest book, *I Heard God Laugh:* A Practical Guide to Life's Essential Daily Habit." You can sign up at https://dynamiccatholic.com/best-lent-ever.

There will be **no Lenten Penance Service** this year. Confessions are 3:45 to 4:30 p.m. each Saturday. Also, you are invited to call to make an appointment for Confession.

One of our Lenten highlights is our weekly Fish Fry each Friday during Lent except Good Friday. Serving begins at 4:30 p.m. and continues until 7:00 p.m. Once again this year the Little Flower Men's Club is managing the Fish Fry. Because of COVID, the Fish Fry will look different this year. There will be limited indoor dining with extra restrictions for COVID safety as well as a drive-through carryout service. Additional information can be found elsewhere in today's Theresean. Please support the Fish Fry by purchasing carryout orders or by attending in person. Each year the Fish Fry earns the parish approximately \$7,000 to \$9,000. This money is included as ordinary income in our annual budget. In the final analysis, the success of the fish fry will depend on the number of dinners purchased. The more people who attend each week, the more successful the fish fry will be. I am profoundly grateful to the Men's Club for continuing to accept responsibility for the Fish Fry and to all who will help with the Fish Fry this year.

Today is the anniversary of the 1993 death of Msgr. Stanley (Duke) Manowski, a priest of the Diocese of Fort Wayne-South Bend. He liked brain teasers. This was one of his favorites for school children: "A man had 3 children and 23 horses. When he died, he left one child ½ of his horses, another child 1/3 of his horses, and the last child 1/8 of his horses. How many horses did each child receive?"

Ash Wednesday is Wednesday, February 17. Masses will be at 9:30 a.m. and 6:00 p.m. The 9:30 a.m. Mass will be live-streamed. Some of our school students will be present at the morning Mass, but we will have room for some parishioners as well.

As with so many things, Ash Wednesday will bring some modifications to the rite due to precautions necessary because of COVID-19. The Vatican and the Archdiocese of Indianapolis have issued directives that require these changes. After the priest blesses the ashes he will address everyone and say the familiar words "Remember you are dust, and to dust you shall return." He sav those words only once, just prior the distribution of ashes. All those who will be assisting with the distribution of ashes will wear a mask. They will take a small amount of ash between their fingers and sprinkle them on the top of the head of each person coming up for ashes without saying anything. Those coming forward for ashes should bow their heads allowing the minister to easily sprinkle on the crown of the head. These changes to the rite will seem awkward and possibly frustrating for those of us accustomed to the "normal" distribution of ashes. Again, as with so much of what we do at Mass, our objective is to take every precaution possible to insure the safety of all of you.


