Fourth Sunday Of Lent

Dear Parish Family,

Today we celebrate the Fourth Sunday of Lent, the mid-point of Lent. The Fourth Sunday of Lent was traditionally called Laetare Sunday. *Laetare* is a Latin word that means rejoice. Therefore, priests are invited to wear rose vestments. This might be a good day to review for ourselves how we are doing keeping our Lenten promises. On Easter Sunday, we want to be able to celebrate not only Jesus' resurrection from the dead 2000 years ago but also our own resurrection to new life with him. This will only be possible to the extent that we have put to death the selfishness and sin that is part of our lives in order to rise to new life in Christ.

This weekend at the Sunday 9:30 a.m. Mass we celebrate the Second Scrutiny with our Elect, our former Catechumens, Our Candidates, and our *Confirmandi*. At the First Scrutiny, the former catechumens were anointed with the Oil of Catechumens, and all the Elect were presented with the Ten Commandments. During the Second Scrutiny, all the Elect receive the Nicene Creed.

Holy Week, the holiest week of the year for Catholics, is only two weeks away. Please note the Holy Week schedule elsewhere in *The Theresean*.

Tomorrow, March 15, marks one year from the last time the adult choir sang at Mass. March 1 marked one year since the youth choir sang at the 6 p.m. Mass. As you may remember, we had no in-person Sunday or weekday Masses from March 18 until May 26.

When people are asked why they chose Little Flower parish or what they like about Little Flower parish, the first response is usually the quality of our liturgical music. I do not think it is an overstatement to say that we have all felt the absence of our adult and youth choirs. They add so much life and beauty to our Liturgy. All of us, I am sure, are looking forward to their return. Adult and youth choir members, we miss you.

At the same time, I want to thank all of our cantors who have helped so much in providing music for our Liturgy this past year: Erin Becker, Janeen Dodds, Gina Foster, Bobbie Lawless, Frank Mackell, Allison McGinley, Eileen Pfeiffer, and Rachel Shaffer. However, we also need to thank Tom Costello, our Music Director, Christen Kring, David Schurger, and Laura Horton, our instrumentalists.


