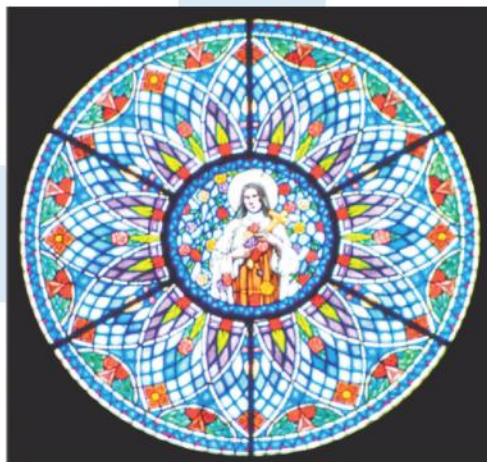

SACRAMENT OF BAPTISM

Baptisms are held on most Sundays during the year. Baptisms are held after the 9:30 am Mass. If you prefer to have your child's baptism scheduled during Mass, you may request this at the time you return the baptism information form. Requests for the date and time specified will be honored to the extent possible. Parents who have not yet received pre-baptismal instruction are required to attend a Baptismal Preparation Class that is held 5 times per year. Call the Parish Office well in advance so that class arrangements may be made.

SACRAMENT OF MARRIAGE

Contact the priest 9 to 12 months in advance. A Wedding Handbook is available from the Parish Office which provides the necessary information on arranging for a marriage.

SACRAMENT OF ANOINTING/MINISTRY TO THE SICK

In an emergency, contact the parish at any time. Please contact the Parish Center if you or a loved one are hospitalized, or are confined to home or a nursing facility, to receive the Eucharist and/or Anointing. Hospitals and healthcare facilities no longer routinely inform churches when a parishioner is admitted.

Dear Parish Family,

Today is Palm Sunday, the beginning of Holy Week. For Christians, and especially for Catholics, Holy Week is the most sacred week of the year. According to Nathan Mitchell, in the earliest days of Christianity, there were no elaborate Holy Week rituals. Instead, the early Christians celebrated Christ's suffering, death, and resurrection in one unified service called the Pascha, i.e., the Christian Passover, or Easter. This was preceded by a short time of fasting in preparation for Easter.

However, already in the 4th century, the unified Easter Liturgy was split into separate Liturgies that celebrated the principal events of Jesus' final week.¹ On Palm Sunday, we celebrate Jesus' triumphant entry into Jerusalem. On Holy Thursday, we celebrate his Last Supper with his disciples during which he instituted the sacraments of Eucharist and Priesthood. On Good Friday, we commemorate his Passion and Death. Finally, on

Holy Saturday, we celebrate his triumphant resurrection from the dead and celebrate the sacraments of initiation with our Elect.

Our Holy Week and Easter Liturgies will be as follows:

Holy Thursday	7:00 p.m.	Holy Saturday	8:00 p.m.
Good Friday	7:00 p.m.	Easter Sunday	8:30 a.m. & 10:30 a.m.

Holy Thursday, Good Friday, and the Easter Sunday 8:30 a.m. Mass will be live streamed. You are invited to attend all of these Liturgies, but you will need tickets for each of them. See information about tickets elsewhere in *The Theresean*.

One of our traditions is to commission or recommission Eucharistic Ministers at the Holy Thursday Mass. This year we will commission or recommission those who are present in person or virtually.

At the Easter Vigil, ten of our Elect will be baptized, confirmed and receive First Communion, one will be received into the Church, confirmed, and receive First Communion, and two already baptized Catholics will be confirmed and receive First Communion. Five are grade school students, and two are high school students. We are delighted to welcome so many into our parish community in the midst of the pandemic.

Lenten promises should be kept until after the Easter Vigil!

Easter Sunday Masses will be at **8:30 and 10:30 a.m.** There will be **NO** 6:00 p.m. Mass. There will be **NO** 5:00 p.m. Mass on Holy Saturday. Also, there will be **NO** confessions on Holy Saturday.

The parish office and Little Flower Catholic School will be closed on Monday, April 5.

As Lent concludes, special thanks to the Men's Club, especially Drew Torzewski, for continuing to host the Fish Frys and thanks to all the regular volunteers, all the weekly volunteers, all those who dined in or picked up dinner, and all those who invited and encouraged others to dine in or pick up dinner.

Have a blessed Holy Week.
