SACRAMENT OF BAPTISM

Baptisms are held on most Sundays during the year. Baptisms are held after the 9:30 am Mass. If you prefer to have your child's baptism scheduled during Mass, you may request this at the time you return the baptism information form. Requests for the date and time specified will be honored to the extent possible. Parents who have not yet received pre-baptismal instruction are required to attend a Baptismal Preparation Class that is held 5 times per year. Call the Parish Office well in advance so that class arrangements may be made.

SACRAMENT OF MARRIAGE

Contact the priest 9 to 12 months in advance. A Wedding Handbook is available from the Parish Office which provides the necessary information on arranging for a marriage.

SACRAMENT OF ANOINTING/MINISTRY TO THE SICK

In an emergency, contact the parish at any time. Please contact the Parish Center if you or a loved one are hospitalized, or are confined to home or a nursing facility, to receive the Eucharist and/or Anointing. Hospitals and healthcare facilities no longer routinely inform churches when a parishioner is admitted.

Dear Parish Family,

The Second Sunday of Easter is also called the Sunday of Divine Mercy. Both in the pre-Vatican II Liturgy and today's Liturgy, the Gospel for this Sunday is the Gospel of the institution of the Sacrament of Reconciliation.

Traditionally the Second Sunday of Easter was called *Dominica in Albis* or Low Sunday. *Dominica in Albis* means Sunday in White. When the Elect are baptized on Holy Saturday, they are clothed in a white garment. In the early Church, they wore the white garment for a week. On the Sunday after Easter, they went back to wearing regular clothes. The Second Sunday of Easter was also the Octave Day of Easter.

Easter Sunday was High Sunday, and its Octave Day was Low Sunday.

Special thanks to all who worked so hard to make our Holy Week and Easter liturgies so beautiful. Tom Costello and all the music ministers, both vocalists and instrumentalists, were outstanding despite the COVID limitations. We look forward to the return of our adult choir. Thanks to Mary Martha Costello and Holly Hodges, the members of the Art and Evangelization Committee, and other volunteers who helped decorate the church. Thanks to all the liturgical ministers, including lectors, Eucharistic ministers, servers, and greeters. Special thanks to Jennifer Dunn who served Holy Thursday, Good Friday, and Holy Saturday.

Special thanks to all of you who participated in the liturgies of Holy Week and Easter. Your presence and participation made them so life giving. What a difference from last year when we celebrated the Triduum and Easter in an empty church! The difference demonstrates the importance of coming together as a faith community to celebrate our faith, the faith that we share. Even those who watched live stream experienced a major difference between last year and this year.

Special thanks to the Family Life Commission who hosted the Holy Thursday Soup Supper. Someone said Anna Marie Gutierrez's soup is the best!

Since the pandemic began, many have asked about candles in church. Beginning this weekend, candles will once again be available as they previously were.

During the Easter morning Masses, Tom sang the Sequence *Victimae Paschali Laudes* in Latin. "The sequence is generally thought to have begun, as a genre of poetry, around the Ninth Century, when Roman chant was flourishing and spreading throughout Europe. As Roman chant was intended primarily as a musical meditation upon the Word of God, so the Sequences at Mass were intended as musical, meditative extensions of the Alleluia verse." Wipo of Burgundy, chaplain of the German Emperor Conrad II during the 11th century, is purported to be its author.

Christians, to the Paschal Victim Offer your thankful praises!

A Lamb the sheep redeems: Christ, who only is sinless, Reconciles sinners to the Father.

Death and life have contended in that combat stupendous: The Prince of life, who died, reigns immortal.

Speak, Mary, declaring What you saw, wayfaring. "The tomb of Christ, who is living, The glory of Jesus' resurrection; Bright angels attesting, The shroud and napkin resting. Yes, my Christ my hope is arisen:

To Galilee he goes before you." Christ indeed from death is risen, our new life obtaining. Have mercy, victor King, ever reigning!

Amen. Alleluia.




Stained Glass Raffle
