It helps the children discover that First Communion is a starting point in living a Eucharistic life.

Congratulations also to Viviana Arboleda-Arellano and Alejandro Lozano who achieved high honors for the third quarter at Cathedral High School.

Monday, May 3, is the Feast of Sts. Philip and James, Apostles. As you may remember, two of the apostles were named James. Traditionally the other James has been referred to as St. James the Greater, and this St. James has been referred to as St. James the Less. St. James the Greater is called the Greater because he followed Christ before this St. James. His feast is July 25. St. James the Less was "the son of Alphaeus" and "the brother of the Lord," i.e., a cousin of Jesus. He was also the leader of the Jerusalem church.

It is interesting that in the Gospels of Matthew, Mark, and Luke, the only mention of Philip is in the list of apostles. However, he plays a more significant role in the Gospel of John. John's Gospel recounts the call of Philip and tells us that Philip was from the same town as Peter and Andrew. Philip then leads Nathaniel to Jesus. Before the multiplication of the loaves and fish, Jesus asks Philip where they could buy enough food to feed all the people. Philip responded telling Jesus that not even 200 days wages would give everyone even a little to eat. In John 12, some Greeks came up to Philip and asked to see Jesus, Philip told Andrew, and the two of them told Jesus. Finally, Philip was part of the conversation at the Last Supper [14:8-9], opening the way for Jesus to explain the unity of the Father and the Son. According to tradition, Philip preached in Greece, Syria, and Phrygia and was martyred in Hierapolis.

I have a question for the parish. At one point there were four men who helped around the parish who were referred to as the Four Horsemen. Art Meier was one. Does anyone know who the other three were? If so, please let me know.




