Dear Parish Family,

I plan to leave on vacation this Friday, July 2. I will return to the office on Wednesday, July 14. During my vacation, there will be no Masses or Communion Services on weekdays. However, the bulletin will include the dates and times of Masses at Holy Spirit, Our Lady of Lourdes, and St. Philip Neri.

Next weekend, July 3 and 4, Fr. Jim Bonke will be the celebrant and homilist at the Saturday 5:00 p.m. and Sunday 9:30 a.m. Masses. Fr. Bonke is a retired priest of the Archdiocese who served as Defender of the Bond at the Tribunal. Fr. Rick Ginther will be the celebrant and homilist at the Sunday 6:00 p.m. Mass. Fr. Rick is the pastor of Our Lady of Lourdes. He was associate pastor here from 1983-1985.

Vacation Bible School is July 19-23 from 6:30 p.m. - 8:30 p.m. for children entering pre-4 to 4th grade in the fall. This is a fun-filled week learning how much Jesus loves us. If your child or children are pre-4 to 4th grade, I would encourage you to sign them up. We also need adult volunteers. Tuesday is the Solemnity of Sts. Peter and Paul. As most of you know, on June 29, 1975, Fr. Jim Farrell and I were ordained in St. Peter's Square by now St. Pope Paul VI. During the ceremony, each of us went up to Pope Paul VI twice, once for the imposition of hands and once for the sign of peace. Although Pope Paul VI appeared distant in pictures and at audiences and ceremonies, I saw great warmth when I looked into his eyes. Tuesday is also the tenth anniversary of Archbishop Thompson's ordination as a bishop.

Saturday is the Feast of St. Thomas the Apostle. Thomas is often called "Doubting Thomas" because of his initial unwillingness to believe in Jesus' resurrection. When Jesus challenged his lack of faith, Thomas responded, "My Lord and my God!" He is associated with the founding of the Church in southern India.

Saturday is also 35th anniversary of the death of Father William Buhmeier. Fr. Buhmeier was associate pastor here at Little Flower from March 30, 1960 to October 4, 1960 and from May 1, 1963 to February 5, 1966.
