SACRAMENT OF BAPTISM Baptisms are held on most Sundays during the year. Baptisms are held after the 9:30 am Mass. Requests for the date and time specified will be honored to the extent possible. Parents who have not yet received pre-baptismal instruction are required to attend a Baptismal Preparation Class that is held 5 times per year. Call the Parish Office well in advance so that class arrangements may be made.

SACRAMENT OF MARRIAGE Contact the priest 9 to 12 months in advance. A Wedding Handbook is available from the Parish Office which provides the necessary information on arranging for a marriage.

#### SACRAMENT OF ANOINTING/MINISTRY TO THE SICK

In an emergency, contact the parish at any time. Please contact the Parish Center if you or a loved one are hospitalized, or are confined to home or a nursing facility, to receive the Eucharist and/or Anointing. #### Dear Parish Family,

We welcome Fathers Jim Bonke and Rick Ginther who will celebrate our Masses this weekend. I am very grateful to them for agreeing to be here this weekend.

Today is July 4<sup>th</sup>, Independence Day. Today is a day to remember and be grateful for all the blessings we enjoy in our country. Our ideals live on in our midst as an ongoing challenge to us and a promise for tomorrow.

Tuesday is the 50<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the death of Fr. John C. Riedinger. Fr. John was pastor of Little Flower from 1942 to 1966. Fr. John was born on May 15, 1882. Fr. John was almost 60 when he was appointed pastor of Little Flower. He retired when he turned 84 although he had suffered a stroke four years earlier. Fr. John was the longest serving pastor of Little Flower. Our beautiful church, which was dedicated on July 8, 1962, was his greatest achievement. Tuesday please offer thanks to God for the gift Fr. John was to Little Flower parish. He was an inspiration to me.

Next weekend, July 10 and 11, Fr. Larry Richardt will be the celebrant and homilist at the Saturday 5:00 p.m. Mass. Fr. Richardt is a retired priest of the Archdiocese who currently lives in our deanery. He served many years on the faculty of St. Meinrad Seminary. Fr. Jim Bonke will be the celebrant and homilist at the Sunday 9:30 a.m. Mass. Fr. Bonke is a retired priest of the Archdiocese who served as Defender of the Bond at the Tribunal. Fr. Rick Ginther will be the celebrant and homilist at the Sunday 6:00 p.m. Mass. Fr. Rick is the pastor of Our Lady of Lourdes. He was associate pastor here from 1983-1985.

Today I want to write about Sunday Mass attendance, which I believe to be the biggest challenge currently facing our parish. For several years we have spoken about this being a challenge for our parish, even pre-dating the pandemic. The pandemic has certainly complicated this problem. And as of now, we estimate our current weekend Mass attendance to be only 60 to 65% of pre-pandemic levels. This means that on average only 6 out of 10 people who attended Mass prior to the pandemic have returned.

Of course, we do need to consider that it is currently summer when people are sometimes away from the parish. Added to this, we still have people who are not comfortable returning to church because of their individual circumstances or even because they have young children who are not yet eligible for vaccination. However, at the same time I know that there are those who are willing to start to go out in social situations or to restaurants but have not yet returned to church.

After more than one year when a dispensation has been in effect allowing people to miss Mass on Sunday, we expected that it might be an uphill battle to return to pre-pandemic Mass attendance. For many people, once a routine is broken it is difficult to get back into that routine. What we need to remember is that this routine of Mass attendance is central to our Catholic faith. Everything we do as a parish flows from the community that begins with our weekly attendance at Eucharist. Weekend Mass attendance is something that we must "rebuild" if we are to continue to thrive as a parish. It is where we form the community that enables us to fulfill our mission and ministries.

We are also seeing that even after people are comfortable returning to church, weekly attendance seems to be an issue. This too is to be expected to some degree. It is easy to skip a week or two after this prolonged period where Mass attendance was not required. However, being a community is best accomplished by regular, weekly attendance at Mass. Our faith is best practiced in community when we can rely on each other for support and encouragement. To be sure there is no misunderstanding, I want to emphasize that this is not a matter of money. I remain so grateful that most of you have continued to generously support our parish financially during this difficult time.

The short story here is that your presence is important. Each and every one of you is important to our community. Each and every one of you is important every week. We simply are not able to be our best when you are not here.

As you read this, I will be away on vacation. I am hoping to see many more of you when I return. I look forward to that day as well as to the day when everyone will feel safe to return to us.
