SACRAMENT OF BAPTISM

Baptisms are held on most Sundays during the year. Baptisms are held after the 9:30 am Mass. If you prefer to have your child's baptism scheduled during Mass, you may request this at the time you return the baptism information form. Requests for the date and time specified will be honored to the extent possible. Parents who have not yet received pre-baptismal instruction are required to attend a Baptismal Preparation Class that is held 5 times per year. Call the Parish Office well in advance so that class arrangements may be made.

SACRAMENT OF MARRIAGE

Contact the priest 9 to 12 months in advance. A Wedding Handbook is available from the Parish Office which provides the necessary information on arranging for a marriage.

SACRAMENT OF ANOINTING/MINISTRY TO THE SICK

In an emergency, contact the parish at any time. Please contact the Parish Center if you or a loved one are hospitalized, or are confined to home or a nursing facility, to receive the Eucharist and/or Anointing. Hospitals and healthcare facilities no longer routinely inform churches when a parishioner is admitted.

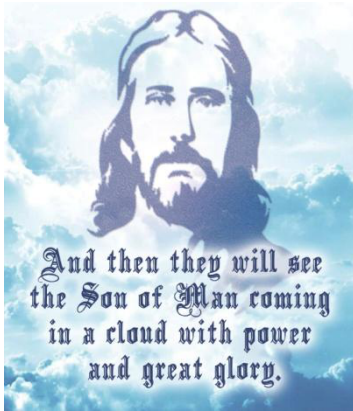

Dear Parish Family,

Thanks to everyone who attended our Thanksgiving Day Mass. Also, special thanks to those who brought food and/or gave in the collection to assist the St. Vincent de Paul Society. Notwithstanding the coronavirus and the problems in our country, we all have much for which to be grateful. God is indeed the giver of all gifts, both divine and human.

Today is the First Sunday of Advent. Advent is a time to prepare to welcome Christ more deeply into our minds, hearts, and lives this Christmas. In the past many of you have participated in Matthew Kelly and Dynamic Catholic's *Best Advent Ever* email program. If you have not already signed up for this year's program, you can sign up at the Dynamic Catholic website: <https://www.dynamiccatholic.com/>. This year's *Best Advent Ever* program is titled "Move Toward the Light with Matthew Kelly."

Our Advent Penance Service this year will be this Tuesday, November 30, at 7 p.m. at Our Lady of Lourdes. Confessions are also on Saturday afternoons from 3:45 p.m. until 4:30 p.m.

Tuesday is the 28th anniversary of the death of Fr. James R. Hoffman. Fr. Hoffman was assistant pastor of Little Flower from February 9, 1955 until September 18, 1958. Because he was assistant pastor when I started first grade, he is one of the first priests I remember.

Friday, December 3, is the Feast of St. Francis Xavier, the Principal Patron of the Archdiocese of Indianapolis. Today we should all pray to St. Francis Xavier for the Church in the Archdiocese of Indianapolis. St. Francis Xavier was a missionary to India, Sri Lanka, Malaysia, and Japan. He and St. Therese are the co-patrons of the Apostleship of Prayer and of the missions.

At our All-Class Reunion, we added three outstanding alumni to our Wall of Honor.

James Rose, Class of 1971, was the son of Ethel and Harry Rose and the twin brother of parishioner Bob Rose. James is a licensed architect currently working for Drexel University. Working for academic institutions allowed James time to volunteer for a variety of community activities, including serving on the Jenkintown Planning Commission for twenty years, including ten years as chairman. James and his wife Barbara have two grown daughters. Barbara and James taught natural family planning (NFP) classes for the Archdiocese of Philadelphia, and now he supports Barbara's work at the Gianna Center of Philadelphia. They also participate in the annual Life Chain and offer prayerful presence at abortion centers in the Philadelphia area. Little Flower provided James with a solid foundation to build his Catholic faith and helped pave the way for a lifetime of service. For being a servant leader through volunteerism and as a pro-life advocate, we honor James Rose as an outstanding alumnus of Little Flower Catholic School.

David Smock, Class of 1985, is the youngest of nine children of Patrick and Julia Smock. David served at Sccecina for more than 15 years, teaching multiple subjects and serving in various roles. Since 2011, he has served as principal at St. Matthew Catholic School. During his time in college, David was "voluntold" by his father Pat to begin a computer database of all LF alumni, helping to foster what is now an amazingly supportive alumni support base. He also helped to digitize all 50+ years of Little Flower's yearbooks, as well as all of Sccecina's and St. Matthew's yearbooks. He is in his 31st year of helping Sccecina football, where he helped re-create their statistical records and record book and helped digitize all of the 60+ years of game films. David says the value he received from his Little Flower education stems from his parents' commitment to Catholic education and service to the parish, school, and community first and foremost. David says, "I received an excellent education, but moreover I learned the importance of faith, family and community." For his commitment to Catholic school education, we honor David Smock as an outstanding alumnus of Little Flower Catholic School.

Stephanie Wendel-Sponsel, Class of 2002, is the daughter of parishioners Jeff and Dawn Wendel. After graduating from Sccecina, she graduated from Indiana University Kelly School of Business. For the last nine years, she has worked at netlogx currently serving as the Chief Operating Officer. Stephanie lives on the Eastside with her husband Bobby and their four children. Stephanie is incredibly dedicated to giving back to the Indianapolis community. In 2018, not only was she a finalist for Indy's Best and Brightest, but she was also a Techpoint Tech 25 award recipient. She also volunteers her time as the finance chair for Our Lady of Lourdes Catholic Parish, as the treasurer of the Indianapolis chapter of the National Association of Women Business Owners (NAWBO), and as a member of the United Way of Central Indiana Tech Fund Work Group. Stephanie believes the education and teachers at Little Flower taught her the value of hard work, relationships, and her religion. 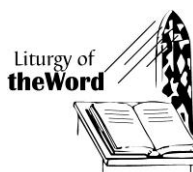

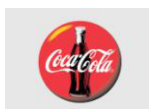
