Hospitals and healthcare facilities no longer routinely inform churches when a parishioner is admitted.



Dear Parish Family,

Today we celebrate World Marriage Day. Therefore, each of our Liturgies will include a special blessing for engaged and married couples.

This weekend at the 9:30 a.m. Mass, we will celebrate the Rite of Enrollment and Illumination with the 2nd graders making their First Eucharist this spring. At this rite, the children will be called forward by name. Along with their parents, they will renew their baptismal promises and receive a lit candle from their parents as a reminder of the light of Christ living within them and their call to be lights to the world. Please pray for these families during this preparation time.

Tuesday is the 31st anniversary of the death of Fr. James Moriarty. Fr. Moriarty was my pastor at St. Matthew parish. He established the first women's retreat house in Indianapolis and later built Fatima Retreat House.

Thursday, February 17, is the 38<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the death of Archbishop Paul C. Schulte. Archbishop Schulte was archbishop from 1946 to 1970. Archbishop Schulte established many parishes throughout the Archdiocese as well as the four Archdiocesan high schools in Indianapolis.

Saturday, February 19, is the 55<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the death of Fr. Ralph Pfau. He was the younger brother of Fr. Jerome Pfau, Little Flower's second pastor. He was the first priest known to have joined AA and spent much of his priesthood ministering to alcoholics and alcoholic priests. Besides 14 Golden Books, he was the author of his autobiography Prodigal Shepherd. Interestingly, he succeeded Fr. John Riedinger, our third pastor, as pastor of St. Ann's when Fr. John was assigned to Little Flower to replace his brother, Fr. Jerome Pfau.

Thanks to all who attended our Little Flower School Open House on Sunday, January 30. Special thanks to Lauren Lay from our school marketing committee who organized, promoted and chaired the event. Also, special thanks to Mary Rodriguez, Amy Torzewski, the teachers, and the School Commission who were present to assist with the open house.

Clearing the snow was especially important because we had the visitation and funeral for Jerry Kennedy Friday morning. 
