Dear Parish Family,

Thanks to Amy and Drew Torzewski who shared their stewardship witness talk with us last weekend. I was not aware of all they do as a family! Little Flower parish is part of the very fabric of their lives, and they are part of the fabric of Little Flower parish.

I also want to thank the combined efforts of the Stewardship Commission and PPS for their collaboration in putting together the Ministry Fair and Pancake Breakfast and the representatives from the various ministries who were present at the fair. Special thanks to Cassie Echegaray of the Stewardship Commission for designing

the online Stewardship Intention Card and putting together the ministry video.

Finally, thanks to all who attended and signed up for ministries. It was really a success due to those who attended the fair. Several ministry chairs were pleasantly surprised by the energy in the room and the number of people who expressed interest in various ministries.

This Wednesday is Ash Wednesday, the beginning of Lent.

On Ash Wednesday, we will celebrate Mass and distribute ashes at 9:30 a.m. and 6:00 p.m. Also, every Friday evening during Lent, there will be Stations of the Cross and Holy Communion at 5:30 p.m.

Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are days of fast and abstinence. The other Fridays of Lent are days of abstinence. The law of abstinence requires Catholics 14 years of age and older to abstain from eating meat. The law of fasting requires Catholics from the age of eighteen until their fifty-ninth birthday to fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. The Church defines fasting as one main meal a day and two smaller meals which if added together would not be larger than the main meal.

Besides ashes on Ash Wednesday, a small remembrance will be available to everyone who comes to Mass on the First Sunday of Lent, March 5-6. Please be here to receive this remembrance which will serve as a challenge to us this Lent.

In the Gospels, Jesus calls us to prayer, fasting, and almsgiving. As Lent begins, I want to strongly encourage all of us to commit ourselves to weekly attendance at Sunday Eucharist. Sunday Eucharist defines us as Catholics. I would also invite everyone to attend *The Presence* to deepen our appreciation of the Eucharist.

Dynamic Catholic is offering **Best Lent Ever 2.0.** According to Dynamic Catholic, "This year...for the first time ever...we're offering you TWO options for BEST LENT EVER. Every day, you will receive two short, practical and inspiring videos in your inbox, each representing a pathway leading toward a better version of you and a closer relationship with God.... And in order to offer a truly transformative experience, we developed two pathways designed specifically to meet you where you are, no matter where you are in your spiritual journey." Please mark your calendars. Our Lenten Penance Service will be Wednesday, March 16, at 7:00 p.m. here at Little Flower. Also, confessions are scheduled from 3:45 to 4:30 p.m. each Saturday except Holy Saturday. Likewise, you are invited to call to make an appointment for Confession.

One of our Lenten highlights is our weekly Fish Fry each Friday during Lent except Good Friday. Serving begins at 4:30 p.m. and continues until 7:00 p.m. Once again this year the Little Flower Men's Club is managing the Fish Fry. Many COVID restrictions that were put in place last year will be lifted, and indoor dining will be at full capacity. Due to its popularity, the drive-through carryout service will remain in place. Please show your support by attending and inviting family, friends, and neighbors to attend. The Fish Fry is a wonderful opportunity for parishioners, family, friends, and neighbors to socialize.

Each year the Fish Fry earns the parish approximately \$5,000 to \$7,000. This money is included as ordinary income in our annual budget. In the final analysis, the success of the fish fry will depend on the number of dinners purchased. The more people who attend each week, the more successful the fish fry will be. I am profoundly grateful to the Men's Club for continuing to accept responsibility for the Fish Fry and to all who will help with the Fish Fry this year.
