Dear Parish Family,

The staff and I want to wish all fathers a very blessed and happy Father's Day. Fathers, like mothers, play a critical role in the lives of their children. Thank you to all the fathers in our parish and all the men of our parish who assume a fatherly role in the lives of children.

Today we celebrate the Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of the Lord, often called Corpus Christi. Today we celebrate our faith in the Real Presence of Christ in the Eucharist. In the former Sacramentary, there was a beautiful alternate opening prayer for today's Solemnity:



Lord Jesus Christ, we worship you living among us in the sacrament of your body and blood. May we offer to our Father in heaven a solemn pledge of undivided love. May we offer to our brothers and sisters a life poured out in loving service of that kingdom where you live with the Father and the Holy Spirit, one God, forever and ever.

Today marks the beginning of the Eucharistic Revival in the Archdiocese of Indianapolis. Please consider joining Archbishop Thompson on **this Sunday afternoon**, **June 19**, to kick off the National Eucharistic Revival in the Archdiocese of Indianapolis.

A vitally important part of the day's celebration is a 1.7-mile Corpus Christi procession from the Cathedral of SS. Peter and Paul to St. John the Evangelist Catholic Church. Our Archdiocese has never had a procession like this before. We are proclaiming our faith in the Real Presence of Jesus in the Eucharist. The procession begins at 4:15pm. ALL ARE INVITED to help us line N. Illinois Street from 14th St. to Georgia St. Complete information and the full schedule for the day can be found at www.eucharisticrevivalindy.org.

The mission of the Eucharistic Revival is "to renew the Church by enkindling a living relationship with the Lord Jesus Christ in the Holy Eucharist." The vision for the Eucharistic Revival is "to inspire a movement of Catholics across the United States who are healed, converted, formed, and unified by an encounter with Jesus in the Eucharist—and who are then sent out on mission 'for the life of the world."

This week I will attend the 2022 Presbyteral Convocation at Saint Meinrad Archabbey from Monday through Thursday. Therefore, there will be no weekday Masses this week until Friday.

Thursday is the Solemnity of the Nativity of Saint John the Baptist. The Church celebrates the Annunciation on March 25. We celebrate Christmas exactly nine months later on December 25. According to Luke's Gospel, Elizabeth was six months pregnant at the time of the Annunciation. Therefore, the Solemnity of the Nativity of St. John the Baptist occurs six months before Jesus' birth. In John's Gospel, John the Baptist said about himself and Jesus "He must increase; I must decrease" [3:30]. St. Augustine noted that the dates of this feast and Christmas were appropriate. After the birth of John (normally celebrated on June 24), the days grow shorter. After the birth of Jesus (December 25), the days grow longer. "He must increase; I must decrease" [3:30].

Friday we celebrate the Solemnity of the Most Sacred Heart of Jesus. This feast celebrates Jesus' superabundant divine-human love for us. The opening words of the Introit or Entrance Antiphon in the pre-Vatican II Liturgy captured the meaning of the Solemnity: "The thoughts of his heart [are] to all generations: to deliver their souls from death and feed them in famine." Also, in the former Sacramentary, the translation of the pre-Vatican II Preface of the Sacred Heart captures the significance of the feast:

In your divine plan your only Son was pierced by a soldier's lance as he hung on the cross; from his wounded heart flow out living waters of compassion and love. That heart has never ceased to beat with love for us, bringing peace to those who love him, and salvation to those who turn in sorrow from their sins.


