Today we celebrate the Solemnity of the Epiphany of the Lord, Jesus' manifestation to the Gentiles. It contains approximately 1,500 pieces of cut glass. One can only imagine the amount of time and effort and cost that went into creating this masterpiece.

On a personal note, once again I want to thank you for your Christmas gifts. You are a wonderfully generous and supportive parish. If I missed sending a thank you note to anyone who gave me a Christmas gift, I apologize. I think if you ask most pastors who "taught" them how to be pastors, it was the pastors of their home parishes and the pastors whom they served under as associates. Fr. Jim Moriarty, with whom I lived at St. Matthew from 1980-1985, always emphasized the importance of thank you notes.
