Fifth Sunday Of LENT

Dear Parish Family,

Today is the Fifth Sunday of Lent. This weekend at the Sunday 6:00 p.m. Mass we will celebrate the Third Scrutiny with all those who will receive Sacraments of Initiation at the Easter Vigil. Last Sunday the Elect were presented with the Nicene Creed. During the Third Scrutiny, all the Elect receive the Our Father.

This coming Friday is our last Lenten Fish Fry. Every year at the last fish fry, someone tells me that he/she wishes that this was not the last fish fry of the year. Because it is the last one, I encourage you to come to the fish fry either to dine in or to carry out.

This Saturday, April 1, will be the last scheduled confessions before Easter. Confessions will be heard from 3:45 to 4:30 p.m. There will be **no** confessions on Holy Saturday, April 8. If anyone would like to make an appointment for confession, please contact me.

Next Sunday is Palm Sunday, the beginning of Holy Week. For Christians, and especially for Catholics, Holy Week is the most sacred week of the year. On Palm Sunday, we celebrate Jesus' triumphant entry into Jerusalem. On Holy Thursday, we celebrate his Last Supper with his disciples during which he instituted the sacraments of Eucharist and Priesthood. On Good Friday, we commemorate his Passion and Death. Finally, on Holy Saturday, we celebrate his triumphant resurrection from the dead and celebrate the Sacraments of Initiation with our Elect.

There is no better way for us to enter into the mystery of Jesus' dying and rising than through celebrating the Triduum as a parish family. However, for those unable to attend, Palm Sunday, Holy Thursday, Good Friday, and Easter Sunday will also be live streamed.

We are asking that no activities conflict with Holy Week services and activities. This would include 5:30 p.m. until 8:30 p.m. on Holy Thursday and from noon until the end of Good Friday.

Next Sunday, Palm Sunday, we will invite all children from toddlers through 8th grade to join in the procession around the church carrying palms. Please encourage your children to participate. Little Flower School students who participate will receive an out-of-uniform pass.

As we prepare to celebrate Holy Week and Easter, I would like to offer a special thanks to our Adult Choir. It requires a big commitment from all the members to sing weekly and that includes a 90 minute practice each week. We are blessed with a wide variety of singers who are willing to make this commitment. This also includes our instrumentalists who play each week, Laura on clarinet, Megan on flute, and Dave on viola. It would not be unusual, particularly in other denominations, for these instrumentalists to be paid, but Laura, Megan, and Dave also volunteer their talents to make our choir even better. They sounded especially wonderful this past Sunday. When you have an opportunity, please thank them for sharing their gifts with us.

Today is the 39th anniversary of the death of Fr. Louis Gootee, the founding pastor of Nativity Parish. Fr. Gootee lived here at Little Flower during his retirement. Saturday is the 53rd anniversary of the death of Fr. John Reidy, who served as an associate pastor at Little Flower from December 1960 to April 1961.
