Did You Know?

What does Lent have to do with those becoming Catholic? In Lent, RCIA participants move into the final period of preparation for the sacraments. They have been nourished by the graces of various ligturgical Rites throughout the RCIA process, which have helped them to embrace God's call. In Lent, God pours purifying and enlightening graces upon them, through the spiritual prepartation they receive in RCIA sessions, the special Rites that mark the Sundays of Lent, and the prayers offered for them by the faithful.

What are the Scrutinies?

These Rites are celebrated to help deliver the elect from the power of sin and Satan, to protect them against temptation, and to give them strength in Christ, who is the Way, the Truth, and the Life (RCIA 141). The Rites of Scrutiny are meant to uncover, and then heal, all that is weak, defective, or sinful in the elects' hearts and to bring out through repentance all that is upright, strong, and good. Three Scrutinies are celebrated in the parish community on the 3rd, 4th, and 5th Sundays of Lent, after the homily. The celebrations of the Scrutinies also remind the whole parish community of the need to reflect on their own sins and the need for God's help.



Don't forget on Sunday, March 12, 2023 at 2 a.m., we will set our clocks forward by one hour. Happy Spring!


