Dear Parish Family,

Thanks to the Invite Commission and the Parish Life Commission for hosting a welcome brunch for new parishioners last Sunday. Three new families attended.

Today is World Mission Sunday. Pope Francis has chosen "Hearts on Fire, Feet on the Move" as the theme for this year's World Mission Sunday. This theme comes from Jesus' encounter with the two disciples on the Road to Emmaus. After Jesus vanished from their sight, "they said to each other, 'Were not our hearts burning within us while he spoke to us on the way and opened the Scriptures to us?" St. Therese and St. Francis Xavier are the patron saints of the missions.

On October 15, Pope Francis released as an Apostolic Exhortation "C'est La Confiance...On Confidence in the Merciful Love of God For the 150th Anniversary of the

Birth of Saint Therese of the Child Jesus and the Holy Face." It may be found in English at https://www.vatican.va/ content/francesco/en/apost exhortations/documents/20231015-santateresa-delbambinogesu.html. In §52, Pope Francis addresses her relevance to today's world.

Tuesday I will be attending the semi-annual Priest/PLC meeting at Saint Joseph Catholic Church in Four Corners.

Tuesday is the 79th Anniversary of the death of Fr. Thomas Scecina for whom Scecina Memorial High School is named. Fr. Scecina served as a military chaplain in World War II. Captured by the Japanese, he was part of the Bataan Death March. In the fall of 1944, the Japanese planned to transfer all the POWs to Japan to serve as slave laborers. He was on the ship Arisan Maru when it was torpedoed by an American submarine that did not know that the ship was a prisoner ship. Scecina Memorial High School opened in 1953.

Saturday is the Feast of Saints Simon and Jude, Apostles. Saint Simon is referred to as the Zealot or Canaanite. Some argue that he was called the Zealot because he belonged to an anti-Roman party. Others argue that he was called the Zealot because of his rigid adherence to Jewish Law. St. Jude, also called Thaddeus ("Courageous"), is the patron of those in despair or of hopeless cases. According to tradition, both were martyred in Persia. Please pray for the priests and parishioners of St. Simon and St. Jude parishes on Saturday.

Besides the presentation of Outstanding Alumni awards and the Bob Kiley Scholarship, we will recognize 2023 anniversary classes.
