SACRAMENT OF BAPTISM

Baptisms are held on most Sundays during the year. Baptisms are held after the 9:30 am Mass. If you prefer to have your child's baptism scheduled during Mass, you may request this at the time you return the baptism information form. Requests for the date and time specified will be honored to the extent possible. Parents who have not yet received pre-baptismal instruction are required to attend a Baptismal Preparation Class that is held 5 times per year. Call the Parish Office well in advance so that class arrangements may be made.

SACRAMENT OF MARRIAGE

Contact the priest 9 to 12 months in advance. A Wedding Handbook is available from the Parish Office which provides the necessary information on arranging for a marriage.

SACRAMENT OF ANOINTING/MINISTRY TO THE SICK

In an emergency, contact the parish at any time. Please contact the Parish Center if you or a loved one are hospitalized, or are confined to home or a nursing facility, to receive the Eucharist and/or Anointing. Hospitals and healthcare facilities no longer routinely inform churches when a parishioner is admitted.

Last Wednesday at the Father Tom Day Mass, Scecina honored three individuals with the Father Tom Service Award – Mrs. Lee Ann Van Benten, Mr. Ott Hurrle ('70), and Mr. Tony Schmoll ('77). Two of the three have a connection with Little Flower. Ott Hurrle is a current parishioner. He was recently recognized for his 50 years of coaching football in an article in *The Indianapolis Star*. Tony Schmoll is an alumnus of Little Flower, Class of 1973.

At our All-Class Reunion on Saturday, November 4, we honored four outstanding alumni. In the next few weeks, I will briefly profile each of them.

The first of these was Cindy (Werner) Woods, Class of 1963. Cindy was the older of two children of Robert and Anna Werner. She attended and graduated from Little Flower, Scecina Memorial High School, and Purdue University where she studied history. She met her husband David at Purdue, and they have been married for 51 years. For many years, Cindy worked as a Special Education teacher in the Indianapolis Public School system.

After many years of being away from the Catholic Church, Cindy returned to Little Flower, her first church home. She brought a friend with her, CAC Diehr, who went through RCIA and became Catholic. Cindy and CAC had a passion for evangelization and outreach. Their passion and leadership led to establishing the *Invite* Commission which is responsible for evangelization, re-evangelization, and outreach to those in need. Cindy also serves in many other ministries within the parish.

Cindy loved her time at Little Flower and has stayed close to classmates. Many things stand out such as kickball, singing at funeral Masses, and Mrs. Brooks, her first grade teacher. However, Cindy recalls, "nothing stands out better than the day I beat Robert Gilday in the 8th grade Spelling Bee." [The truth is Cindy always defeated me in any spelling bee. She was definitely the best speller in our class.]

Cindy related that going to Little Flower School taught her how to love and respect God, how to give, how to enjoy simple things, how to question, and how to treat others. She said, "God has blessed me, taught me, and held my hand through some very rough times. To Him be the Glory."

For her years as a teacher of Special Education students and her passion and leadership as a member of Little Flower parish, we honored Cindy Werner Woods, Class of 1963, as an outstanding alumna of Little Flower Catholic School.

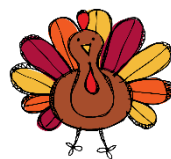

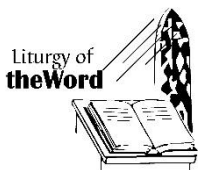
