

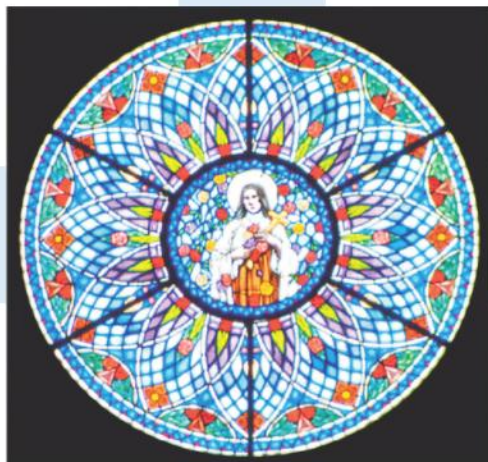

SACRAMENT OF BAPTISM

Baptisms are held on most Sundays during the year. Baptisms are held after the 9:30 am Mass. If you prefer to have your child's baptism scheduled during Mass, you may request this at the time you return the baptism information form. Requests for the date and time specified will be honored to the extent possible. Parents who have not yet received pre-baptismal instruction are required to attend a Baptismal Preparation Class that is held 5 times per year. Call the Parish Office well in advance so that class arrangements may be made.

SACRAMENT OF MARRIAGE

Contact the priest 9 to 12 months in advance. A Wedding Handbook is available from the Parish Office which provides the necessary information on arranging for a marriage.

SACRAMENT OF ANOINTING/MINISTRY TO THE SICK

In an emergency, contact the parish at any time. Please contact the Parish Center if you or a loved one are hospitalized, or are confined to home or a nursing facility, to receive the Eucharist and/or Anointing. Hospitals and healthcare facilities no longer routinely inform churches when a parishioner is admitted.

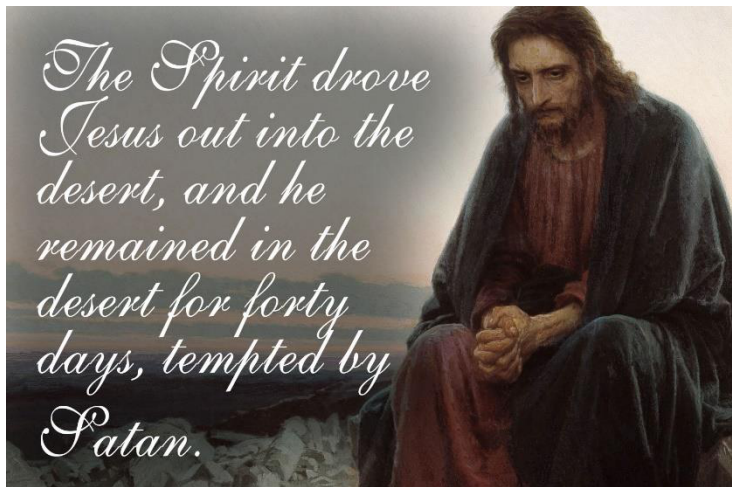

Dear Parish Family,

During Lent, our RCIA (Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults) catechumens & candidates begin their final preparation for the sacraments of Baptism, Confirmation, and Eucharist which they will receive at the Easter Vigil Liturgy. This weekend we will celebrate the Rite of Sending at the 9:30 a.m. Mass.

We, as a community, send our catechumens and candidates to the Cathedral for the Rite of Election. At the Rite of Election, on the basis of the testimony of their sponsors and catechists and on the reaffirmation of the intention of the catechumens and candidates themselves, Fr. James Brockmeier, representing Archbishop Thompson, will declare them ready to take part in the Sacraments of Initiation. This year we have two catechumens. In addition, at the Easter Vigil, two adult candidates will be received into the Catholic Church and receive First Eucharist and Confirmation and four adult Catholics will receive the Sacrament of Confirmation.

Thanks to all who returned their completed stewardship cards. If you have not returned yours, please return it as soon as possible either online or through the collection or through the mail or by dropping it off at the parish office. Little Flower and Scecina school families must turn in their 2024 stewardship cards in order to be eligible for the parishioner tuition discount.

At the same time, I would encourage parents to encourage your children to be good stewards of their time, talent, and treasure. When I was a child, my parents, as did most of the parents of my friends, insisted we put some of our own money into the Sunday collection. Today, for example, I would hope that parents of children sixth grade and up would encourage their children to become altar servers.

During Lent, the Archdiocese schedules several of the annual special collections. However, sometimes additional collections are added in times of special need. Unfortunately it makes it seem as though the Church is asking for money all the time. The reason the Church schedules these during Lent is because it is during Lent that we are especially called to prayer, fasting, and almsgiving. Please do not feel obligated to contribute to all of them. Although all are good causes, support the ones that you feel called to support.

As you know, the money that we receive through the Lenten baby banks is divided between the Gabriel Project and a charity designated by the parish. As a parish we have chosen once again to help Miracle Place here on the Eastside. Miracle Place, located at 940 Temple Avenue, provides education, meals, love, and encouragement to children and adults in their neighborhood.

The LF Athletic Commission and LF PPS hosted the annual Reverse Raffle and Bingo Night on Saturday Feb 3. The night was a huge success, topping last year's attendance with nearly 300 people at the event! Thank you to all who attended or encouraged friends and family to attend. Thanks to all the hard working volunteers from LF Athletics and PPS who made the night possible. And special thanks to the Dugan, Kantner, Lathrop, and Torzewski families for planning and organizing this important function. This year's final profit of almost \$13,000 will be equally split to benefit the Little Flower Athletic Association and the Little Flower PPS.

RCIA

Did You Know?

What does Lent have to do with those becoming Catholic?
In Lent, RCIA participants move into the final period of preparation for the sacraments. They have been nourished by the graces of various liturgical Rites throughout the RCIA process, which have helped them to embrace God's call. In Lent, God pours purifying and enlightening graces upon them, through the spiritual preparation they receive in RCIA sessions, the special Rites that mark the Sundays of Lent, and the prayers offered for them by the faithful.

What are the Scrutinies?
These Rites are celebrated to help deliver the elect from the power of sin and Satan, to protect them against temptation, and to give them strength in Christ, who is the Way, the Truth, and the Life (RCIA 141). The Rites of Scrutiny are meant to uncover, and then heal, all that is weak, defective, or sinful in the elects' hearts and to bring out through repentance all that is upright, strong, and good. Three Scrutinies are celebrated in the parish community on the 3rd, 4th, and 5th Sundays of Lent, after the homily. The celebrations of the Scrutinies also remind the whole parish community of the need to reflect on their own sins and the need for God's help.
