Requests for the date and time specified will be honored to the extent possible. Parents who have not yet received pre-baptismal instruction are required to attend a Baptismal Preparation Class that is held 5 times per year. Call the Parish Office well in advance so that class arrangements may be made.

Contact the priest 9 to 12 months in advance. A Wedding Handbook is available from the Parish Office which provides the necessary information on arranging for a marriage.

SACRAMENT OF ANOINTING/MINISTRY TO THE SICK

In an emergency, contact the parish at any time. Please contact the Parish Center if you or a loved one are hospitalized, or are confined to home or a nursing facility, to receive the Eucharist and/or Anointing. Hospitals and healthcare facilities no longer routinely inform churches when a parishioner is admitted.



Dear Parish Family,

Today we celebrate the Fourth Sunday of Lent, the mid-point of Lent. The Fourth Sunday of Lent was traditionally called Laetare Sunday. Laetare is a Latin word that means rejoice. Therefore, priests are invited to wear rose vestments. This might be a good day to review for ourselves how we are doing keeping our Lenten promises.

This weekend at the Sunday 9:30 a.m. Mass we celebrate the Second Scrutiny with our Elect, our former Catechumens, Our Candidates, and our Confirmandi. At the First Scrutiny, the former catechumens were anointed with the Oil of Catechumens, and all the Elect are presented with the Ten Commandments. During the Second Scrutiny, all the Elect receive the Nicene Creed.

Holy Week, the holiest week of the year for Catholics, is only two weeks away. Please note the Holy Week schedule elsewhere in The

RECYCLING DUMPSTER

Some parishioners and neighbors have used our recycling dumpster from time to time. Recently we have been incurring additional charges from WM Company for "contamination" in our recycling. Contamination occurs when non-recyclable items are mixed with recyclable items, and extra work must be done to separate them. When there is contamination, we are charged \$96 per incident.

The most common type of contamination is when recyclables are put inside plastic garbage bags, then put into the dumpster. Please do not put plastic garbage bags in the recycling dumpster. There is a list on the side of the dumpster that details what can be placed into it. We appreciate everyone's cooperation.


