SACRAMENT OF BAPTISM

Baptisms are held on most Sundays during the year. Baptisms are held after the 9:30 am Mass. If you prefer to have your child's baptism scheduled during Mass, you may request this at the time you return the baptism information form. Requests for the date and time specified will be honored to the extent possible. Parents who have not yet received pre-baptismal instruction are required to attend a Baptismal Preparation Class that is held 5 times per year. Call the Parish Office well in advance so that class arrangements may be made.

SACRAMENT OF MARRIAGE

Contact the priest 9 to 12 months in advance. A Wedding Handbook is available from the Parish Office which provides the necessary information on arranging for a marriage.

SACRAMENT OF ANOINTING/MINISTRY TO THE SICK

In an emergency, contact the parish at any time. Please contact the Parish Center if you or a loved one are hospitalized, or are confined to home or a nursing facility, to receive the Eucharist and/or Anointing. Hospitals and healthcare facilities no longer routinely inform churches when a parishioner is admitted.

Christ's Entrance Into Jerusalem

Dear Parish Family,

Today is Palm Sunday, the beginning of Holy Week. Today we celebrate Jesus' triumphant entry into Jerusalem.

Holy Week is the most sacred week of the church year. I want to encourage all of you to attend as many of the Holy Week services as possible. Please check the complete schedule elsewhere in the bulletin.

The **Archdiocesan Chrism Mass** will be **Tuesday, March 26, at 2 p.m. at the Cathedral**. Archbishop Thompson will bless the holy oils that will be used for the next year, and the priests of the Archdiocese will renew their commitment to the priesthood and priestly service in the Archdiocese.

Holy Thursday celebrates Jesus' Last Supper with his apostles at which he instituted the sacraments of Eucharist and Holy Orders and washed their feet. Our **7:00 p.m. Mass of the Lord's Supper** includes the Presentation of the Oils, the Washing of the Feet, the Commissioning of Eucharistic Ministers, the transfer of the Eucharist to the altar of reposition, and the stripping of the altar and sanctuary. The Entrance Procession will include our Elect, our First Communion candidates, our Confirmation

candidates, and our Eucharistic Ministers.

Our Holy Thursday Liturgy will be preceded by a Soup Supper in Duffey Hall at 5:30 p.m. and followed by Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament until 9:00 p.m. Adoration will conclude with Night Prayer at 9:00 p.m.

The Blessed Sacrament Chapel will be closed from before the Holy Thursday Liturgy until after the 10:30 a.m. Mass on Easter Sunday.

Good Friday commemorates Jesus' Passion and Death. Our **7:00 p.m. Celebration of the Lord's Passion** will include the Liturgy of the Word, the Veneration of the Cross, and Holy Communion. There is no Mass on Good Friday. Living Stations of the Cross will be celebrated at 9:30 a.m. and 1:00 p.m. on Good Friday. Good Friday is a day of fast and abstinence.

On **Holy Saturday**, we will celebrate the **Easter Vigil at 8:00 p.m.** Our Liturgy will include the Service of Light with the blessing of the new fire and the Paschal Candle, the Liturgy of the Word, the Liturgy of Christian Initiation, and the Liturgy of the Eucharist.

At the Easter Vigil, one person will be baptized, confirmed, and receive First Communion, and three adults will be received into the Church, confirmed, and receive First Communion. In addition, four already baptized Catholic adults will be confirmed.

Lenten promises should be kept until after the Easter Vigil!

The reason many people give for not attending these Liturgies is their length. Actually, neither the Holy Thursday nor the Good Friday Liturgy takes more than 1 hour and 15 minutes. The Holy Saturday Liturgy lasts approximately 2 hours.

Easter Sunday Masses will be at **8:30 a.m. and 10:30 a.m.** There will be **NO** 6:00 p.m. Mass. There will be **NO** 5:00 p.m. Mass on Holy Saturday. Also, there will be **NO** confessions on Holy Saturday.

The following Holy Week services will be live streamed: Holy Thursday Mass of the Lord's Supper (7:00 p.m.), Good Friday Living Stations of the Cross (9:30 a.m.) and Celebration of the Lord's Passion (7:00 p.m.), and the Easter Sunday 10:30 a.m. Mass.

The parish office and Little Flower School will be closed on Monday, April 1.

As Lent concludes, special thanks to the Men's Club, especially Drew Torzewski, for continuing to host the Fish Frys and thanks to all the regular volunteers, all weekly volunteers, all those who dined in or picked up dinner, and all those who invited and encouraged others to dine in or pick up dinner.

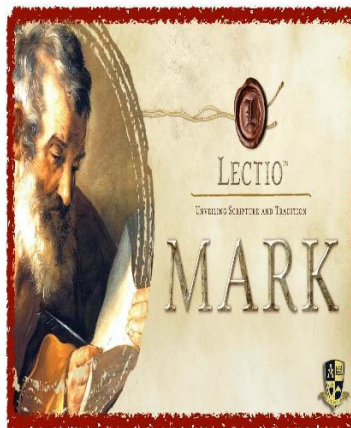

The Little Flower conference makes home visits to those who have requested financial assistance, furniture, appliances, household items and other basic needs. Housing aid and utility assistance are also available.

The Little Flower official neighborhood is bounded roughly by Sherman Drive to I-70 to Arlington to 10th Street. From 5/1/23 to 3/15/24 we helped 502 people, 225 of whom were children. This is made possible by donations.

When a month has 5 Sundays (like March) a special envelope is available for donations to SVDP to be placed in the collection. For those that contribute electronically, that option is now available. is at a critical crossroad and needs your help.**

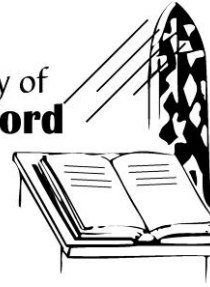

That purpose continues today along with educational programs, social outings, monthly meetings, annual plant sale, fellowship, bake sales, fish fry desserts, and flowers for holiday decorating in church. The Ladies Club is open to any woman of the parish 18 years and older with annual membership dues of \$15.00. Each year funds are given to the parish at the end of the fiscal year to help with the general budget. Participation has dwindled in the past several years, indicating a lack of interest in participating in this ministry or perhaps not understanding what the Ladies Club does for the parish. Spring is time for our election of officers, and we have the following offices open – President and 1st Vice President. The other offices are being filled by dedicated women who have committed to another year in their current office. If we are unable to fill these offices, the Ladies Club will have to disband. What a shame to witness a 100-year-old ministry come to an end.
