

May is the month of the Blessed Virgin Mary. We will celebrate May Crowning this Friday, May 3, at the 9:30 a.m. Mass. All are invited to attend this beautiful traditional ceremony.

However, there are also many ways to honor Mary in your homes. If you have a statue of Mary, you can create a May altar. Also, you might want to pray the rosary more often and/or pray the Litany of the Blessed Virgin Mary (also called the Litany of Loreto). Finally, you can say the Memorare daily.

Friday is also the Feast of Sts. Philip & James, Apostles. As you may remember, two of the apostles were named James. Traditionally the other James has traditionally been referred to as St. James the Greater, and this St. James has been referred to as St. James the Less. St. James the Greater is called the Greater because he followed Christ before this St. James. His feast is July 25. St. James the Less was "the son of Alphaeus" and "the brother of the Lord," i.e., a cousin of Jesus. He was also the leader of the Jerusalem church. It is interesting that in the Gospels of Matthew, Mark, and Luke, the only mention of Philip is in the list of apostles. However, he plays a more significant role in the Gospel of John. For example, John's Gospel recounts the call of Philip and tells us that Philip was from the same town as Peter and Andrew.



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
