SACRAMENT OF BAPTISM

Baptisms are held on most Sundays during the year. Baptisms are held after the 9:30 am Mass. If you prefer to have your child's baptism scheduled during Mass, you may request this at the time you return the baptism information form. Requests for the date and time specified will be honored to the extent possible. Parents who have not yet received pre-baptismal instruction are required to attend a Baptismal Preparation Class that is held 5 times per year. Call the Parish Office well in advance so that class arrangements may be made.

SACRAMENT OF MARRIAGE

Contact the priest 9 to 12 months in advance. A Wedding Handbook is available from the Parish Office which provides the necessary information on arranging for a marriage.

SACRAMENT OF ANOINTING/MINISTRY TO THE SICK

In an emergency, contact the parish at any time. Please contact the Parish Center if you or a loved one are hospitalized, or are confined to home or a nursing facility, to receive the Eucharist and/or Anointing. Hospitals and healthcare facilities no longer routinely inform churches when a parishioner is admitted.





Excerpt from a homily Fr. Bob gave on the Eucharist:

“Let me suggest an explanation of Real Presence that makes sense to me. Physical food and drink nourish us because as they are digested, they become part of our body, part of us. For this to happen, we have to eat and drink. In other words, I cannot make part of me something that is outside the boundaries of my body. My soul, my spirit, my being, is limited by my body.

Jesus, however, is not limited by his body. In the words of consecration, Jesus identifies the bread and the wine with himself, with his body and blood: “This is my body.... This is my blood.” In other words, he extends his soul, his spirit, his being, to the bread and wine, transforming them sacramentally into his body and blood.

My brothers and sisters, most of us were excited when we received our First Communion. We believed that the Eucharist really was the body and blood of Christ. We saw the Eucharist with eyes of faith. Sometimes as we grow up, we stop seeing with eyes of faith. To believe in the Real Presence of Christ in the Eucharist, we have to see with eyes of faith.”



The National Eucharistic Pilgrimage began on Monday, May 19 from New Haven, CT on the Seton Route and will make their way to Indianapolis for the National Eucharistic Congress July 17-21.

Route update:

St. Elizabeth Ann Seton Route (East)

Our Eucharistic Lord entered one of America’s most iconic cities as joyful pilgrims gathered to pray and worship Jesus in the Eucharist in New York. The Pilgrimage itinerary included the shrines of both St. Elizabeth Ann Seton, patron saint of the route, as well as St. Frances Cabrini. At the historic St. Patrick’s Cathedral, 2,500 worshipers joined Cardinal Timothy Dolan as he celebrated Mass, and [1,000 attended Benediction](#) at Our Lady of Lebanon Maronite Cathedral in Brooklyn Heights.

Processions took place through Central Park, past Yankee Stadium, and across the Brooklyn Bridge, while pilgrims sang in both English and Spanish along the way. Some of the perpetual pilgrims even accompanied Cardinal Timothy Dolan by boat for a [Eucharistic blessing at the Statue of Liberty](#). With three different dioceses coming together for these events, Bishop Brennan of the Diocese of Brooklyn observed how this was a beautiful example of being “a part of something much bigger than ourselves” and that “we’re not alone in our faith, but we’re never alone whenever we’re walking with the Lord” ([The Tablet, May 27, 2024](#)).






