SACRAMENT OF BAPTISM

Baptisms are held on most Sundays during the year. Baptisms are held after the 9:30 am Mass. If you prefer to have your child's baptism scheduled during Mass, you may request this at the time you return the baptism information form. Requests for the date and time specified will be honored to the extent possible. Parents who have not yet received pre-baptismal instruction are required to attend a Baptismal Preparation Class that is held 5 times per year. Call the Parish Office well in advance so that class arrangements may be made.

SACRAMENT OF MARRIAGE

Contact the priest 9 to 12 months in advance. A Wedding Handbook is available from the Parish Office which provides the necessary information on arranging for a marriage.

SACRAMENT OF ANOINTING/MINISTRY TO THE SICK

In an emergency, contact the parish at any time. Please contact the Parish Center if you or a loved one are hospitalized, or are confined to home or a nursing facility, to receive the Eucharist and/or Anointing. Hospitals and healthcare facilities no longer routinely inform churches when a parishioner is admitted.

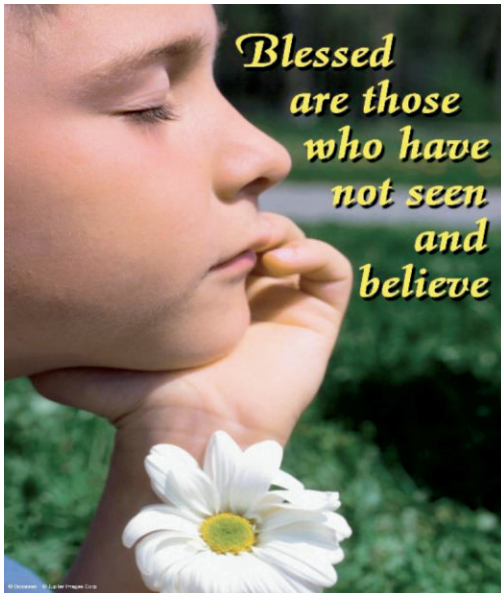

I was certainly surprised when the first words I heard on the radio on Monday morning were that Pope Francis had died. Although he has been in such poor health, I was surprised because he seemed to be recovering and greeted people several times over the Triduum and Easter Sunday. Please pray for Pope Francis and for the Church.

The Second Sunday of Easter is also called the Sunday of Divine Mercy. Both in the pre-Vatican II Liturgy and today's Liturgy, the Gospel for this Sunday is the Gospel of the institution of the Sacrament of Reconciliation.

It seemed to me that our Holy Week and Easter Liturgies could not have been more beautiful. Thank you to everyone who attended our Holy Thursday, Good Friday, and Easter Vigil Liturgies. Your presence and participation made them so life giving. On Holy Saturday and Easter Sunday, 934 people attended Mass at Little Flower, which is 133 more than last year.

Special thanks to all who worked so hard to make our Holy Week and Easter liturgies so beautiful. Tom Costello and all the music ministers, both vocalists and instrumentalists, were outstanding. Most of our music ministers were here Tuesday evening of Holy Week for practice, Holy Thursday, Good Friday, Holy Saturday, and two Easter Masses. Thanks to the members of the Art and Environment Committee and other volunteers who helped decorate the church. Thanks to all the liturgical ministers, including lectors, Eucharistic ministers, servers, and hospitality ministers.

An extra special thanks to Dick Kramer who created and set up the Empty Tomb with help from the Men's Club, and to Joyce Wyne for sewing the beautiful baptismal garments.

Likewise, an extra special thanks to Ryan Davis who designed our beautiful Easter candle this year. If you get a chance, please take a look at it.

PEW REFINISHING PROJECT

As Father Bob prepares to end his 22 years as pastor/administrator of Little Flower, and as the parish begins the celebration of its 100th Anniversary, we are in the midst a project to refinish the pews in our church.

Countless people have been in and out of these pews during the 62 years since they were last professionally refinished. In addition, the constant cleaning after every Mass when we reopened church during Covid had a negative effect. Today there is no way to match the quality of the pews, so it seems refinishing is the answer.
