SACRAMENT OF BAPTISM

Baptisms are held on most Sundays during the year. Baptisms are held after the 9:30 am Mass. If you prefer to have your child's baptism scheduled during Mass, you may request this at the time you return the baptism information form. Requests for the date and time specified will be honored to the extent possible. Parents who have not yet received pre-baptismal instruction are required to attend a Baptismal Preparation Class that is held 5 times per year. Call the Parish Office well in advance so that class arrangements may be made.

SACRAMENT OF MARRIAGE

Contact the priest 9 to 12 months in advance. A Wedding Handbook is available from the Parish Office which provides the necessary information on arranging for a marriage.

SACRAMENT OF ANOINTING/MINISTRY TO THE SICK

In an emergency, contact the parish at any time. Please contact the Parish Center if you or a loved one are hospitalized, or are confined to home or a nursing facility, to receive the Eucharist and/or Anointing. Hospitals and healthcare facilities no longer routinely inform churches when a parishioner is admitted.

Dear Parish Family,

This Sunday, June 29, is the Solemnity of Sts. Peter and Paul. On June 29,1975, 50 years ago, Fr. Jim Farrell and I were ordained in St. Peter's Square by Pope Paul VI, who is now a canonized saint. Sunday is also the 14th anniversary of Archbishop Thompson's ordination as a bishop.

Please welcome Fr. Nick Dant who will be the celebrant and homilist at the 9:30 a.m. and 6:00 p.m. Masses this Sunday.

It has been suggested that I include some of last Sunday's homily in this week's Theresean letter.

It is the Eucharist that defines us as Catholic Christians. Celebrating Sunday Eucharist is the most important thing we do as Catholics....As I have said many times, it is our Liturgy, especially our music, and our welcoming spirit that draw people to Little Flower.

In my first homily, I said, "I want you to know that I believe this parish is your parish." Therefore, today I want to say that as a parish we have accomplished wonderful things these last 22 years, you and the staff far more than me. Little Flower is blessed with so many wonderful parishioners who give so generously of their time, talent, and treasure. Little Flower is blessed with a staff that is so committed to and engaged in the life of the parish. Thank you!

The first weekend of a priest in a new parish is always difficult. He looks out and sees a sea of strange faces. The last weekend of a priest in a parish is also always difficult. He looks out and sees a sea of familiar faces that he will not see again in the same way. After 22 years, you are my family. I know most of you at least by face, by Mass, or by pew.

Twenty-two years in a parish is a long time. I have witnessed so many changes. I am sure that some of the children I baptized my first years are now married and have children. I know for sure that at least two have died. All of us are 22 years older. Many of the leaders of the parish when I first arrived have left their leadership roles, and some have passed to the Lord. Many parishioners have moved in, and many have moved out. There have been many highlights and a few low lights during these twenty-two years.

I am very grateful to all of you. The staff and really all of you have been very kind, supportive, and generous to me. I hope you will be as kind, supportive, and generous to Fr. Jude and Deacon Gary. I believe Fr. Jude will be a wonderful pastor and Deacon Gary will be a wonderful deacon. Even though I will still live at Little Flower for the time being, I will miss serving as your pastor. When I prepare couples for marriage, I tell them that there are no perfect people and no perfect relationships. Likewise, there are no perfect priests. Therefore, I want to apologize to anyone whose feelings I may have hurt or whom I did not serve well.

Finally, my brothers and sisters, I want to make the words of Paul to the Philippians my final words to you:

I thank God for you every time I think of you, and every time I pray for you all, I pray with joy. I am sure that God who began this good work in you, will carry it on... You are always in my heart!...my deep feeling for you all comes from the heart of Christ Jesus. I pray that your love will keep on growing more and more and your lives will be filled with the truly good qualities which only Jesus Christ can produce, for the glory and praise of God.



Acceptable Items

All donations are appreciated, however the following items are usually in short supply:

- Washers, dryers, refrigerators, stoves (no gas appliances)
- Dressers, chests of drawers, night stands
- Bicycles (adult sizes preferred)
- Dining room or kitchenette tables and chairs
- Small appliances: toasters, irons, can openers, coffee makers, slow cookers
- Pots and pans and cooking/eating utensils
- Dishes, glassware
- Fans, area rugs, vacuum cleaners
- Couches, loveseats, upholstered chairs, sectional sofas (no more than 2 pieces), recliners, coffee and end tables
- Soft goods: clothing, shoes, purses, bed linens, towels, blankets, curtains

Please put your clothing and other soft good donations into plastic trash bags, and household items in boxes. Keep in mind we are seeking basic household items that are in good enough condition to give to people without resources to purchase them.
