



If you have a child in 3rd grade or above who has not made their First Eucharist, please contact Lisa at 317-357-8352, ext. 105 or lgibbons@littleflowerparish.org as soon as possible.

A requirement for First Eucharist is to be a baptized Catholic and a member of our parish. If your son or daughter has not been baptized in the Catholic Faith, please contact the parish center for more information. Generally speaking, at least one parent of a child being presented for Baptism must be Catholic.

The next Baptism Preparation Class is Monday, August 18 at 7:00 p.m. in the Parish Center. This class is required for parents who are requesting baptism for their child and have not previously attended a preparation class. Please call the parish center at 317-357-8352 to let us know if you plan to attend. Plan ahead, as the next class will not take place until November.



PLEASE READ MYKA BLACKWELL'S JOURNEY OF FAITH:

Hello, Little Flower!

In Spring of last year, I became interested in the Christian faith and eventually Catholicism in particular. When I saw that the local Catholic Church was only five minutes away and was offering OCIA classes within the next couple of months, I got in contact as soon as I could. Learning more about Catholicism brought the Christian faith to life for me. It made me realize that being a Christian is not just something you practice in addition to all the other aspects of your life. It's an entire identity that transforms and sanctifies every part of your life. It changes how you go about your duties, your happy moments, your sad and angry moments, your frustrations, and more. Becoming Catholic was the single most important decision I've ever made.

Since I had not known any Catholics, I initially didn't have a sponsor to help me go through the process. However, the people at Little Flower worked hard to help find me one, and I'm eternally grateful because without my sponsor, I wouldn't be writing this letter today. I received all three Sacraments of Initiation (Baptism, Confirmation, and Eucharist) on April 22, 2025, at the Easter Vigil. I chose St. Thérèse of Lisieux, the Little Flower, as my Confirmation saint. She emphasized the fact that you don't have to be a great leader or brilliant thinker or change-maker to be holy. She said, "Jesus does not demand great actions from us, but simply surrender and gratitude."

Throughout OCIA, I was impatient because I thought I knew everything there was to know and just wanted to get initiated into the Church as soon as possible. Every Mass where I would have to cross my arms instead of taking the Eucharist, knowing that it was Jesus Christ in flesh and blood, pained me. After months of being instructed by the OCIA team, I'm so glad I went through the process and didn't rush it. It taught me a great deal of patience along with everything else. We were taught about what Catholics believe, Sacred Scripture and Tradition, Church history, how we ought to live our lives, and more. You will meet so many great people who will be there for you even after you finish OCIA. Whether you are just inquiring about Catholicism or are already committed to joining the Church, OCIA will be a great experience for you.




