Contact the priest 9 to 12 months in advance. A Wedding Handbook is available from the Parish Office which provides the necessary information on arranging for a marriage.

SACRAMENT OF ANOINTING/MINISTRY TO THE SICK

In an emergency, contact the parish at any time. Please contact the Parish Center if you or a loved one is hospitalized or confined to home or a nursing facility, to receive the Eucharist and/or Anointing. Hospitals and healthcare facilities no longer routinely inform churches when a parishioner is admitted.

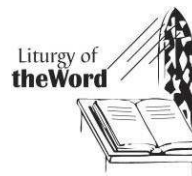

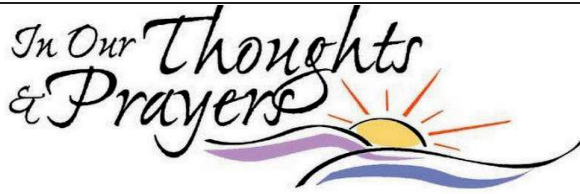

Generally speaking, at least one parent of a child being presented for Baptism must be Catholic.

- T–Z: Desserts

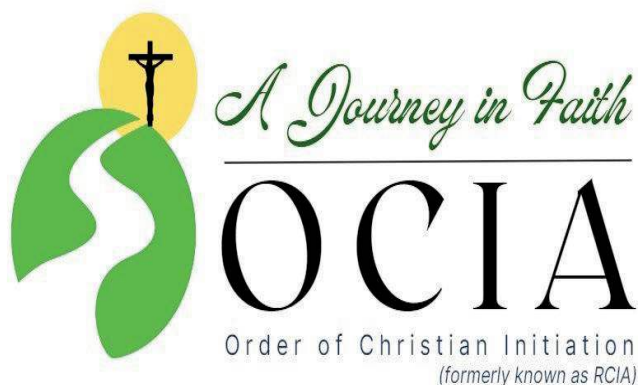

PLEASE READ HAYLEY HUNTLEY'S JOURNEY OF FAITH:

Hello Little Flower,

A few years ago, becoming Catholic wasn't something I ever would have seen coming. I had explored religion before, but never found a faith community that I could settle into. The first real step on that journey was surprisingly simple. My boyfriend, Connor, who would later become my sponsor, invited me to join him at the parish euchre club on Wednesday evenings. It wasn't an invitation to become Catholic or even to attend OCIA. He was simply trying to help me become a better Hoosier, since I proudly proclaimed myself as one despite not knowing how to play euchre, a red flag I didn't realize at the time. Through that simple invitation, I got to know the people of Little Flower. Before long, I found myself wondering what this "Mass" they kept talking about was actually like, and over the next year I began attending as a curious observer.

That curiosity was further nurtured through Connor and one of my oldest friends, Molly, who is also Catholic. Neither of them ever particularly tried to convince me to become Catholic, in fact it was almost the opposite, they simply lived their faith. There was a peace and kindness about them that I was drawn to, and I wanted to understand where it came from. As I continued attending euchre and Mass, my naturally curious and analytical side began to take over. I started asking bigger questions: How do we know Jesus truly existed? How can we trust that the Scriptures were written by honest people who faithfully shared their experiences? What does a 'miracle' actually mean?

Those questions led me to begin my own research. I read extensively from both Catholic and broader Christian spiritual writers, searching not only for answers but for a deeper understanding of the faith. I started listening to the Bible In A Year Podcast, by Fr. Mike Schmitz and supplemented those listenings with additional written works, including Jen Fulwiler's *Something Other Than God*, Lee Strobel's *A Case for Christ*, C.S. Lewis' *Mere Christianity*, and a pocket summary of St. Thomas Aquinas' *Summa Theologiae*. These resources challenged me to think beyond the assumptions I had previously held and consider perspectives I had never seriously explored. At the same time, the more I learned, the more I realized how much I didn't know. I wanted conversations with people who could help me continue exploring these ideas, and naturally, OCIA felt like the next step in that journey.

What I appreciated most about OCIA was that questions were welcomed. Some of the Church's teachings were difficult, and the call to live differently challenged many of my assumptions and priorities. I wrestled with ideas like judgment, transubstantiation, the Rosary, and many others. Fr. Bob often stayed after class so I could ask questions, I wasn't comfortable raising in front of everyone. I was always met with patience, kindness, and thoughtful answers that encouraged me to keep searching. As the months passed, my questions didn't disappear, but my trust grew. I realized faith isn't about having every answer immediately; it's about continuing to seek the truth with an open heart. Through the guidance of Matthew, Lisa, Fr. Bob, Connor, and so many others, curiosity slowly became conviction.

One of the greatest gifts I've found through the Catholic faith is peace. In a world full of noise and distraction, Mass has become a refuge. And looking back, I'm grateful my journey began not with someone trying to change my mind, but with a simple invitation and the quiet example of faithful people. That invitation opened the door, but it was the patience of this community, the willingness to answer difficult questions, and God's grace that ultimately led me through it.
